Highlights from last month

Women in Nuclear Global Annual Conference by Haske Reiling

Last month the Women in Nuclear Global Annual Conference took place in London. The conference theme, Positively Nuclear, was well chosen and reoccurred in all sessions throughout the conference. The main message? **Be proud to be a professional women working in the nuclear sector and dare to speak up!** With over 800 attendants from all over the world it was a truly special and impressive experience. The atmosphere was, in line with the theme, positive and inspiring.

On the Sunday night before the start of the conference the general assembly was held at the conference location. During this assembly, Women in Nuclear Netherlands was invited to introduce itself as a new chapter and got a warm welcome.

The conference offered a variety of technical topics but was mainly focused on empowerment, personal development and inclusion. The first day of the conference set the stage with an enthusiastic, funny and engaging presentation from Dr Jo Lackenby on debunking some persistent nuclear myths and addressing common public concerns about nuclear energy.

Keynotes of the subsequent days were a highly motivating story from Grace Stanke, Nuclear Engineer and former Miss America, on how to become an influencer on the topic of nuclear and an incredibly inspiring speech from Dame Kelly Holmes, Double Olympic Gold Champion, on never giving up on living your dreams. Some other highlights were the Panel session on The Race to Net Zero, the keynote of Director General Rafael Mariano Grossi, IAEA and, a personal favorite, the research of Emily Hutchinson on diversity in STEM leadership.



I enjoyed the interactive and creative presentation skills. There was a choose your own ending presentation, panel sessions with answer buttons with funny alarms, a wheel to decide who will answer the question and many other story telling techniques.

I was very impressed to see so many women from many countries proudly working in Nuclear. Every Women in Nuclear chapter is different and each country has their own challenges. However, in the end, we all have the same goal, creating a sustainable, inclusive future for nuclear.
